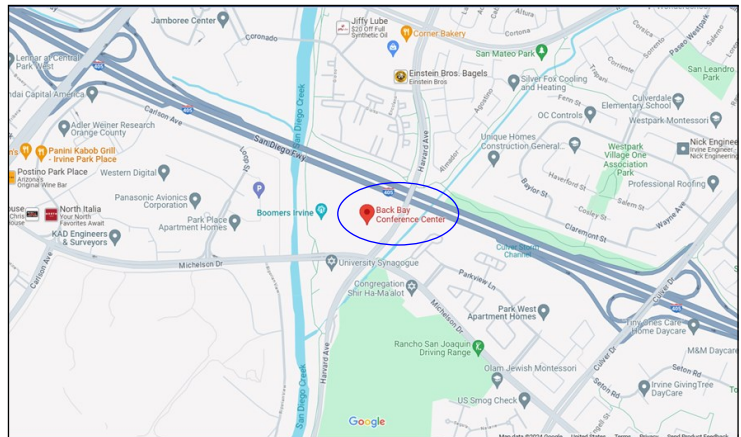

- Come and join us at the Back Bay Conference Center! Guests are always welcome!!



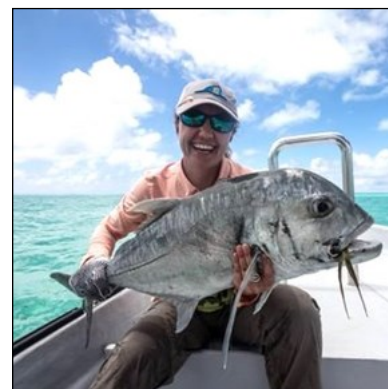

This Month's Speaker

Fly Fishing Idaho with Steph Albano



The Henry's Fork and Silver Creek rivers of Idaho are where technical water meets exceptional scenic beauty and should be on everyone's destination list. Despite or because of their challenges, both rivers play a key role in the history of American fly fishing. The Henry's Fork watershed in eastern Idaho and western Wyoming encompasses 1.7 million acres and over 3,000 miles of rivers, streams, and canals. High mountain streams and warm natural springs form the headwaters of the Henry's Fork of the Snake River, which flows through deep canyons as it descends to the agricultural land of the upper Snake River Valley. Some of the greatest fly fishermen to ever apply their craft have looked to the Henry's Fork waters to test their skills. What has set a few apart is their ability to kindle the imagination of fishermen everywhere.

Steph will talk about both locations -from "The Ranch" to Silver Creek's preserve, managed by the Nature Conservancy. Whether you want to tackle this as a do-it-yourself trip or book guides and comfortable lodging, Steph's presentation will share access points, hatches, and details about the famous water you've heard about. In addition, there are several not so famous places you might want to consider, and she will provide details and resources for your consideration.

Her company, **Finatical Flyfishing** specializes in hosted travel for women as well as booking trips for couples, and private group or corporate trips. She will have information available on all the trips **Finatical Flyfishing** has planned. If you are thinking about a personal, group or corporate trip, you'll walk away with options.

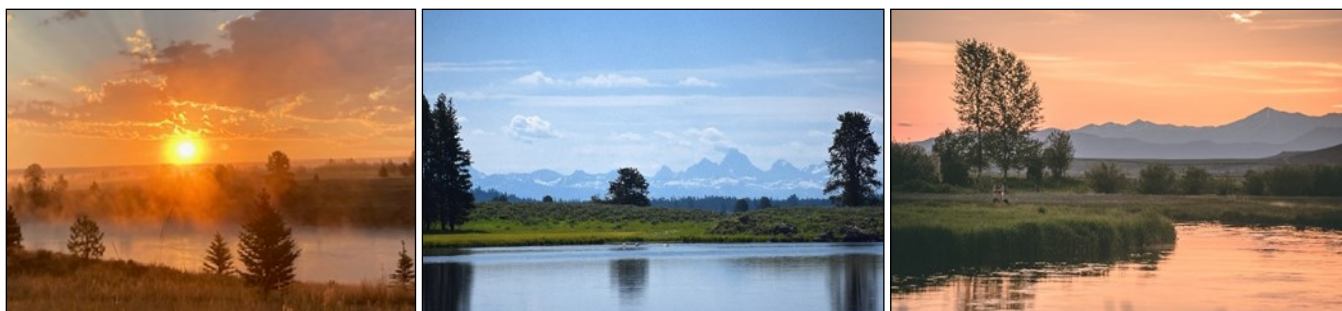
Steph's story:

Mentor Outing Trip Report

Lower Owens River (Bishop, CA)

March 23-24, 2024



One of us lost all his rods and reels when a thief broke into the back of his truck. One of us lost his fly box with hundreds of flies, open-faced, floating down river. And one of us took a swim after a misstep getting out of the river. And this was just the mentors getting ready for the weekend!

I believe the mentees all had a great time fishing and learning. On Saturday, March 23, six reasonably new members of our club joined nine experienced members for this year's Mentor Outing.

Most of the mentors were able to get to the Lower Owens River at least a day early to check out the river conditions and shake the cobwebs off their rods. It was on Friday, the day before the mentees arrived, that all the calamity struck with the loss of rods, flies and dry clothes.

Saturday and Sunday things on the river were great. We all expected cold weather and were greeted with a bit warmer conditions than we expected. The wind was challenging, but it often is in that valley.

On Saturday morning, we paired each mentee with a mentor and set off to ply our section of river. While it threatened to rain off and on during Saturday, no substantive rain materialized. We were treated to wonderful lunchtime entertainment when a passing cloud dropped sleet and small hail at the same time we were basking in the full warm sun! The wind created a nice opportunity to sharpen casting forms to avoid being blown off target.

Around 11am - 2 pm we saw hatches on the river. The hatches were mostly baetis, with one or two caddis emergences. These emerging bugs excited many of the smaller fish into making repeated splashy rises in many pools. I don't believe anyone was successful with any top action flies. All of the fish were taken on nymphs, mostly midges, perigons or pheasant tails.

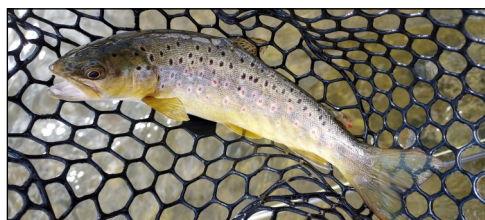
The group had two nice dinners together to swap tales, photos and ask questions. As a mentor, I really enjoyed getting to know the newer members better.

Sunday, we rearranged mentee parings so that they could work with a different mentor. We agreed to knock off by 2:00pm since the forecast was for heavy rain to start and we all wanted to drive back to Orange County. The hatches started a bit earlier and at times were rather heavy under an overcast sky. But again, the fish were fooled by the nymphs.

So, by the end of the weekend only the lost rods and reels were of any consequence. The fly box was recovered downstream by one of the mentors and wet clothes dry fast in the semi-desert air of Bishop.

On Tuesday (March 26) and Wednesday (March 27) Fly Fishers Club of Orange County Club members introduced 121 students from Huntington Beach High School to our sport of fly fishing at Eisenhower Park in Orange.

For a number of years our Club has collaborated with Sarah Hatfield, science teacher that hosts the raising of trout under our "Trout in the Classroom" outreach program. Under this program Club members Ken and Rosie Beck have for many years delivered the trout eggs to classrooms in Orange County.

Additional activities that complemented the release of trout into the park's pond, included the opportunity for the 9th grade science students to:

- Learn about fly fishing equipment (e.g. waders, boots etc.),
- Practice knot tying,
- Practice casting our club's fly rods into the park's pond, and
- Observe a demonstration of tying the "mop fly" and allow a few students to try the fly.

FFCOC Bridgeport Outing 2024

September 26 - 30



Dates: September 26-30. Arrive on a Thursday (9/26), and Depart on a Monday (9/30). Three full days of fishing the Bridgeport area (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday)! You may of course arrive/depart earlier or later as your schedule availability permits.

Waters: There are numerous great fishing opportunities in the area; including stream fishing the East Walker River, West Walker River, Virginia Creek, Buckeye Creek, Robinson Creek, and more. Stillwater fishing on Bridgeport Reservoir, Kirman Lake, Lundy Lake, the Upper or Lower Twin Lakes, or on the Virginia Lakes. Private waters are also available for a fee (Sceirine Ranch, Nevada). **Note:** Due to the 2023 rainfall and snowpack, the area reservoirs filled, flows on the creeks, streams and rivers were back in good shape last year, and the fishing was great! The Blue Ribbon East Walker River and its Miracle Mile fished "lights out"!!

2024 Outings - Bridgeport (Con't)

Fishing: Independent fishing format. Members disperse to their desired fishing locations in the morning (as singles, or better yet, buddy up). Guided fishing is also available; Ken's Sporting Goods in Bridgeport has a list of recommended local guides for hire to put you on fish! Then after a day's fishing, the group will rendezvous at the evening campfire at our host Lodge to discuss the day's fishing, share a beverage or two, and discuss our plans and strategies for the next day.



Lodging: Willow Springs Resort ([Willow Springs Resort in Bridgeport, CA](#)), approximately 5 miles south of Bridgeport off Hwy 395, is our home base for the outing. Standard single rooms (queen bed), Kitchenette rooms (one queen and one double bed) for those who wish to buddy up and share a room/expenses, and 30A full hook-up RV sites are available for your lodging choices.



Standard Single Rooms are \$150/night. The Standard Room includes: One queen bed, Private Bathroom, Wi-Fi and Satellite TV, Heating and Air Conditioning, Mini refrigerator, Microwave, and Coffee maker.



Kitchenette Rooms are \$200/night. Kitchenette Rooms include: One queen bed, One double bed, Private Bathroom, Wi-Fi and Satellite TV, Heating and Air Conditioning, Coffee maker and Toaster, Microwave, Mini refrigerator, Stove top range, and Silverware/dinnerware/cookware.



RV sites are \$55/night. RV Sites have Full Hook Ups; 30A Electrical, Water, and Sewer connections. [This is the only FFCOC Outing that offers a RV lodging option! Come on you RVers, let's meet in Bridgeport!!](#)

Responsibilities: Outing attendees are responsible for transportation, lodging and meals. Convenient dining (breakfast, lunch or dinner) is available across the street at Virginia Creek Settlement (this is a gem of a restaurant), or in town. Based on attendee interest, an evening group BBQ can be arranged for Saturday evening. Traditionally, the group meets our final evening (Sunday) at the Virginia Creek Settlement for dinner. Most importantly, bring your favorite trout fishing gear!

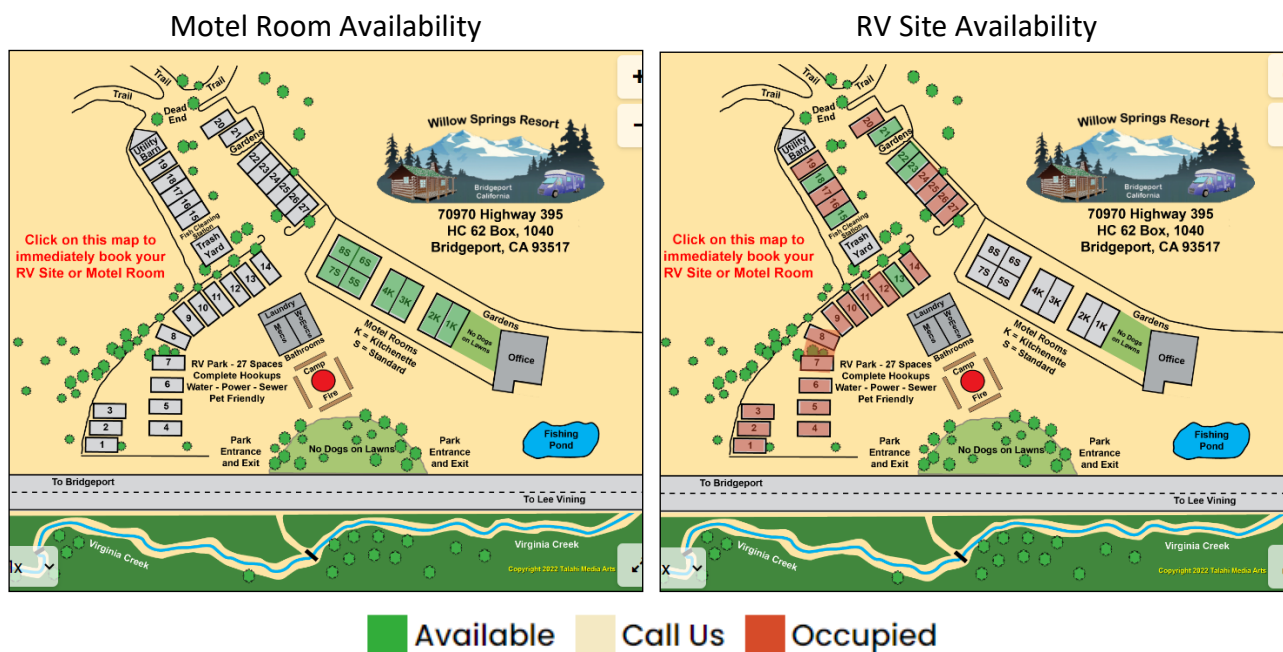

How Skiing Improved My Fishing

Several years ago, I wanted to improve my skiing. Each year its was harder to “just muscle” my way down the hill and I wanted to keep skiing.

I found a program called “ski college” where a former US Olympic skier would teach me how to ski with less effort and more control. The first thing John, the instructor, did was give us little notebooks. He said we would not improve much without keeping a logbook. He proceeded to open the secrets of moguls and double black diamond runs by demonstrations, videotaping our drills and frequent stops to jot down thoughts in our logbooks.

After a week of amazing education and practice, I was skiing at a level I had only imagined in the past. I had achieved my goal of learning how to extend my skiing years well past retirement age.

How does this relate to fishing?

I began a fishing logbook the spring after my ski college experience. I was amazed by the value of logging in my skiing education and wondered if a similar benefit would apply to my fishing.

Yes! Once I started logging my fishing experience I seemed to accelerate my fishing skills. After a few years, I settled down to a format that I find useful. Each trip is now recorded at a level of detail that is both short enough to get done at the end of each day and long enough to be useful for review later on.

I record the standard variables that we all know: weather, water conditions, bugs present, tackle and setup, etc. I also spend time reflecting on what didn’t go well and what did. This is where I learn the most. The time spent reflecting enough to write a short description seems to clarify and cement my understanding of what the fish taught me that day.

I think this process of logging my experience is helping to deepen my understanding of fish and their environment under water. Try it and let me know your experience.

Flies That Keep On Giving!

Damsel Fly Nymph

By John Williams

One of the flies that seems to be overlooked usually is the Damsel Fly Nymph. I carry a few with me where ever I go. Here is one that has served me well many times.



Materials:

Hook: Daiichi 2220 size 12
Thread: Olive 70 UTC
Eyes: Melted Mono Filament
Wire Rib: Extra Small Gold
Tail & Body: Golden Olive Marabou
Glue: Super Glue Gel Formula
Legs: Mallard Flank feather or Wood Duck
Dubbing: Dark Olive Ice Dubbing

Instructions:

1. Melt a piece of 50# monofilament at both ends and allow to cool while holding it in tweezers.
2. Place the hook in the vice and tie in the eyes 1 1/2 eye spaces behind the eye.
3. Tie in the gold rib wire behind the eyes and secure all the way back to the bend and leave hanging to the rear.
4. Select a marabou feather with several feather tips and moisten your fingers and smooth back to a tip. Tie in leaving a tail a full shanks length beyond the bend.
5. Run your thread forward to behind the eyes for now.
6. Smear a very slight amount of super glue on the shank and wrap the marabou feather forward holding the butt of the feather. and tie off behind the eyes.
7. Counter wrap the wire forward to behind the eyes and tie off and remove excess.
8. Select a mallard flank feather or wood duck feather with long fibers and tie in behind the eyes. Split the fibers into two groups to form the legs using your thread to separated secure. Fold the butt section rearward and dub the thorax
9. Pull the butt section of the marabou feather forward over the center area of the eyes and secure with a couple of thread wraps. pull the butt of the mallard back over the center of the eyes and secure with a few thread wraps and cut the butt off square with the back of the thorax.
