Fly Tying

FLIES THAT KEEP ON GIVING Callibeatis Nymph A “Must Have Fly” for Southern Utah

HOOK:	Daiichi 1560 #12-14 or equivalent
BEAD:	7/64" Gold Bead
THREAD:	Black Uni 8/0 or UTC 70
RIB:	Fine Gold Wire
TAIL:	Badger Fur Guard Hairs
UNDER ABDOMEN:	Gray Blood Marabou
ABDOMEN BACK:	Pheasant Tail Fibers
THORAX:	Peacock Hurl
FLASH BACK:	Medium Pearl Tinsel
LEGS:	Pheasant Tail Fiber Tips
HEAD CEMENT:	Super Glue



Tying Instructions:

1. Place the bead on the hook small hole first. Mount in vise.
2. Start the thread behind the bead and form a ball to keep the bead in place while tying the rest of the fly.
3. Tie in the rib and wrap the thread to the bend securing the gold wire rib.
4. Cut a small clump of Badger Fur from the skin. Remove the fuzz from the guard hairs. Align the fiber tips somewhat, it's not critical. (You can use a hair stacked to do this.) Tie in as a tail. Wrap to behind the bead, trim excess.
5. Tie in five pheasant tail fibers above the barb with the tips facing forward and the rest hanging back for now.
6. Tie in six gray blood marabou fibers above the barb with the tips forward past the bead. Wrap the tying thread forward to the back of the bead to form the abdomen. Tie off behind the eye.
7. Pull the pheasant tail fibers over the shank of the hook to form a darker abdomen back and tie off behind the bead.
8. Counter wrap the gold wire up in a spiral fashion to form the rib that holds the pheasant tail fiber in place. Tie off behind the eye.
9. Tie in the medium pearl tinsel behind the bead. Tie down over an area of about two bead widths. Trim excess and let the rest lie to the rear.
10. Tie in three peacock hurls. Bring thread to back of bead. Wrap the peacock to form a thorax. Tie off and trim. Tie in three or four pheasant tail fiber tips on either side of the thorax to form the legs.
11. Pull the tinsel over the thorax to form the shell back, tie off and whip finish.
12. Add the slightest amount of super glue to the wraps to hold everything in place and secure it for life.
